19th June afternoon session: The Movement Program Provider Training 2-5pm

Suitable for clinicians, SaLT's, OT's, Teachers, SENCO's, Tutors, Psychologists and parents.

Led by Alan Heath:

Understand how specific developmental movements can impact upon learning and literacy and also become a qualified Provider of The Movement Program (TMP). This is an ideal programme for parents to use at home with their children, clinicians to recommend or for use within a school setting led by a Teacher, SENCO or other staff.



TMP can be followed by anyone from around 7 years of age and is 15-20 minutes per day, 5 days a week for 12 weeks. Streamed directly to an internet-enabled device, TMP develops in complexity each week and covers the following areas: -

- ✓ Beat competency and rhythmic awareness to improve listening and attention
- ✓ Bi-lateral and cross lateral integration to improve sequencing of information and other areas
- ✓ Primitive reflexes that inhibit learning potential
- ✓ Visual motor skills to improve hand to eye coordination for writing, reading, catching and other areas
- ✓ Improving vestibular function, balance and sensory processing
- ✓ Gross and fine motor development
- ✓ Relaxation and stress reduction

No equipment is required and extensive school trials since 2004 show the real benefits to motor skills, reading and GCSE exam results when the 12 week program is completed.

20th & 21st June: The Listening Program Certified Provider Training. 9 – 5pm each day

Suitable for clinicians, Occupational Therapists, Speech & Language Therapists, Teachers, Psychologists and anyone working in the area of SEND and learning improvement.

The Listening Program (TLP) is an evidence-based music listening therapy already in use in many schools across the UK and worldwide.



It is designed to improve auditory and sensory processing for all pupils and particularly those with special educational needs. Research from the University of Sheffield as well as Leigh Academies Trust in Kent shows the impact TLP can have upon listening, attention, reading, balance, coordination and many other areas vital to reduced stress and improved performance in school and everyday life.

TLP simply requires putting on a pair of headphones for 15 to 30 minutes per day and listening to the psychoacoustically altered music which is designed to retrain the brain and nervous system.

Easy to implement in school or home, either for an individual or in larger groups, TLP can improve the ability to access the curriculum and process sensory information.

Many pupils with challenges with reading, listening, memory and attention have underpinning problems with the basic processing and sequencing of information or are unable to concentrate when auditory and visual distractions are present.

TLP fundamentally improves processing and timing in the brain to increase the opportunity to engage with what is being taught.

At the end of the course you will:-

- ♪ Understand how auditory and sensory processing affects learning
- ♪ Appreciate that many pupils with learning and behavioural challenges have underpinning sensory and processing issues that can be improved
- ♪ Be fully qualified to implement or oversee the implementation of TLP within your school setting
- ♪ Understand and have direct listening experience of the range of TLP program options available



Join us to gain the skills, knowledge and qualification to implement TLP in your school or therapy practice. Help your pupils or clients to improve their fundamental sensory and auditory processing skills.

TLP listening options include iPod Touch, CD and online streaming versions beginning at under €20 per month through subscription.

The Barn is a restored Grade 2 listed Medieval Manor house dating from 1430 with original timbers etc. It is now a heritage centre hosting a range of activities in the arts, crafts and historical events. A free short guided tour is available if required. The Courtyard room is a modern extension with excellent teaching facilities.

Location and parking

Dronfield is an old market town halfway between Sheffield and Chesterfield, close to the Peak District. Why not take a short break in the Peak District the weekend before or after the courses. Trains run hourly to Dronfield from both Sheffield and Chesterfield. The venue is a short walk uphill from the station. For those travelling by car there is plenty of free parking in the Sainsbury's car park at the rear entrance to the Barn gardens.

Food and Drink: Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided. In order to give you more choice lunch is not included, but can be ordered from the café menu and paid to the café staff before the course starts.
